Funding that has been approved to date is for the purposes of conducting the Master Plan process only. No funding for the implementation (construction) of improvements has been identified or discussed.


Meeting #1: Question 1: What are some words that come to mind when you think about Memorial Park?







Plan Goals - Memorial Park

Reveal [history]

Existing Condition Section: Post Oak efforts, Land Use History, Plant and Ecosystem Research

Opportunity: Remembering the multi-layered history and ecology of the site, the Kessler Plan, Copper Smelter, and wider Manhattan Heights Neighborhood and its connection to the city

Goal: Contextualize historic elements to inform design decisions, such as materials and history that can inform future uses

Activate [recreation]

Existing Condition Section: Existing Uses, Areas of Interest

Opportunity: Encouraging sporadic uses of movement, play, and recreation throughout the site that is complementary and multi-generational

Goal: Embrace activity through discovery nodes along pathways, creating moments of rejuvenation

Knit [connectivity]

Existing Condition Section: Arrival to Site (transit, pedestrian, mobility, driving), Internal Circulation, Assets found in neighborhood

Opportunity: Find opportunities to draw community in through multiple modes of transit, prioritizing key entrances throughout the site

Goal: Strengthen connections within the park and community

Rejuvenate [modernizing amenities]

Existing Condition Section: Inventory analysis, amenity analysis

Opportunity: Introducing new types of uses that can encourage community investment, or local entrepreneurship, alongside uses that prioritizes familial gathering

Goal: Enhancing experiences for multi-generational audiences by attracting people to this historic neighborhood and historic space

Unify [cultural expression]

Existing Condition Section: Identify barriers to accessing park,

Opportunity: Bridging multiple ethnic backgrounds/cultures to ensure unified vision for future uses that are complemented by spaces for

Goal: Inviting a celebration of architecture and culture through art, wayfinding, and programming. Create viewsheds that draw connections to the region and aim to unify across cultures, language, and perspectives
